When Helene made initial landfall in Aiken County, I don't believe any of us were prepared for the extent of its destruction. We all have been impacted in one way or another and for some the recovery will be months into the future. It is heartbreaking that lives were lost and that many are dealing with extensive damage to property. We pray for all who were and will continue to be impacted.

From the onset, we assisted with higher than normal requests for **food and clothing**. Initially our food resources were hindered and we worked tirelessly to secure enough inventory to continue our daily Food Pantry and our eight monthly food distributions in the outlying communities. Having access to adequate and nutritious food has been an ongoing concern for many of our clients well before Helene and will continue to be a priority for those impacted.

Individuals with prescription and other medical and dental needs can access ACTS Medical Assistance Program for services. This will help alleviate the difficult financial decisions that many face when prioritizing critical needs.

ACTS is prepared for an uptick in requests for **utility assistance** to prevent disconnection of service now that power has been restored. This service is of particular importance to seniors with medical issues and families with young children.

Our volunteers have stepped up to help in various roles. Though many were personally impacted, they are committed to helping those whom they perceive have greater needs.

These are trying times and the needs are great. Recovery is just beginning for many of our clients. Yet we are humbled by the ongoing generosity of those who provide hope through their overtures of kindness. There is no doubt that God is with us as we continue along our journey.

Thank you to our many partners who have come together to show compassion for our community.




Boy Scout Troop 110 Benefits Those Impacted By Helene
